## From the Desk of Charlie, Jr.

Hi Human Friends,

Hooray! Gino, Pippa, Silver, Kindle, who were all featured in our last newsletter, in one place or another, have found their forever homes!



Over the past few months we have seen a lot of activity here at the shelter. My friend Maizy, who is supervising the repair jobs, has been keeping me up to date on the progress.

"While our Boarding area was being rebuilt, all the inhabitants were temporarily relocated to the leukemia building, except me. It was fun walking right through the walls from one end to the other. Now everything is finished: new walls, new doors, a new floor, and everybody is back home." After the Boarding area, the hallway between Boarding and Gang got a facelift. You can see Maizy, perched on top of the cat tree, keeping an eye on the work. What she did not see were the new outside doors in front and in back. Next winter there will be a lot less cold air coming in around the doors

Next came the hallway by our Senior and Gang sections. This time I was able to see every step of the work being done: take up the old floor tiles, mop, mop, mop the floor to remove the old glue, put down floor leveler, then adhesive and finally the new tiles, seal and wax them; take off the old paneling, put on the new panels and make them fit; put new walls around the litter room; vinyl panels and a new door in the Junior's room; and then the biggest surprise: tear down the 4 dreary old Gang Bins and replace them with two airy new bins, complete with new windows, ledges, lighting and screen covered fronts so the visitors can see the cats.

Open House is coming up and I hope you will come and see my brothers and sisters enjoying our recently refurbished living areas. They are simply gorgeous!

### Driving Directions:


Coming from Illinois...take I-94 East to Indiana exit 40B (Hwy 20/35 for Michigan City). Take that road till you come to the exit for Hwy 212 North (about 1/2 mile). When on 212 get into the left hand lane. We are on the left side of the road at the end of the curve in the highway.

Coming from Michigan...take I-94 West to exit 40B and follow the above directions.

Coming from South Bend...Take the 80/90 Toll Road West to La Porte Exit 49. When you come off the exit head North (a right turn) on Hwy 39. Go to the traffic light (Hwy 20) and turn left. Take Hwy 20 to the exit for Hwy 212 North (about 5-6 miles). When on 212 get into the left hand lane. We are on the left side of the road at the end of the curve in the highway.

## CAT FACTS

Have you ever tried to feed your cat food that was just taken out of the refrigerator? Most cats prefer their food at room temperature, and will boldly REFUSE any food that is too cold or too hot.

In English, cat is "cat." In French, cat is "Chat." In German, your cat is "katze." The Spanish word for cat is "gato," and the Italian word is "gatto." Japanese prefer "neko" and Arabic countries call a cat a "kitte."

Cats get their sense of security from your voice. Talk to your cats! And be mindful of your tone of voice. Cats know when you're yelling at them (though they *may not care*).

The richest cat in the Guinness Book of World Records is a pair of cats who inherited \$415,000 in the early '60s. The richest single cat is a white alley cat who inherited \$250,000. (Now *that* will buy a lot of catnip!)

The Giraffe, Camel and Cat are the only animals that walk by moving **both** their left feet, then **both** their right feet, when walking. This method of walking ensures speed, agility and silence.

It is believed that a white cat sitting on your doorstep just before your wedding is a sign of lasting happiness. White cats are a symbol of good luck in America, while black cats are a sign of bad luck.

Cats **can** see in color!

Cats are partially color blind. They have the equivalency of human red/green color blindness. (Reds appear green and greens appear red; or shades thereof.)

Cats don't see "detail" very well. To them, their person may appear hazy when standing in front of them.

Cats need 1/6th the amount of light that humans do to see. Their night vision is amazing!

Cats can see up to 120 feet away. Their peripheral vision is about 285 degrees.

Cats eyes come in three shapes: round, slanted and almond.

The color of a kitten's eyes will change as it grows older.

At birth, kittens can't see or hear. Cats open their eyes after five days and begin to develop their eyesight and hearing at approximately 2 weeks. They begin to walk at 20 days.

Kittens begin dreaming at just over one week old.

A cat's ear pivots 180 degrees. They have 30 muscles in each ear, and use twelve or more muscles to control their ear movement.

A group of kittens is called a "kindle."


A group of grown cats is called a "clowder."

Cats rub up against other cats, and people, in an attempt to "mark" them with their scent glands. They most often use the scent glands between their eye and ear (near the temple area) or their scent glands near the base of their tail.

What kind of "mood" is kitty in? Her eyes, whiskers and ears will tell you. Learn to read the signs she gives you.

The most popular names for female cats in the U.S. are Missy, Misty, Muffin, Patches, Fluffy, Tabitha, Tigger, Pumpkin and Samantha.




### Is your pet a sex offender?


