Letter from the Director

Dear Loyal Supporters,

Thank you all for you continued support of our efforts here at Fried's Cat Shelter. All your donations, large or small, are greatly appreciated.

We have a very special friend that would like to tell you his story upon coming to the shelter.

"Hello, my name is Baron. I came to the shelter on July 7, 2017. I was a stray that had stepped on some hot tar and severely burned the pads on both my front feet. The tar had already dried on my feet before a nice family found me and brought me to Fried's Cat Sheter.

When the staff tried to see if they could remove the tar they immediately noticed the damage to my feet and took me straight to a vet. The vet said I had to stay there, and while there he got the tar off my feet and started treating me with antibiotics right away. I stayed with the nice people at the vet for four days, and upon returning to the shelter I was continued on a new antibiotic for another 7 days.

For the next couple of months I made bi-monthly trips to the vet so he could check the progress on my feet. In the meantime, I had to stay confined to a treatment cage to keep my movement down to a minimum, and had to have puppy pee pads in my litterbox. I also had to have daily cleanings of my feet. September 20th was my last vet trip. By this time one foot had completely healed, and the other still had a small raw spot by the top of the pad by the base of the toes. The vet said that the spot is in a good place and will continue to heal well.

That last vet visit also gave me another milestone...I moved into a big bin which I have to myself (even though I still have to use the pee pads in the litter box). When the staff noticed that it was hard for me to get to the window ledge without hurting that one foot, they made me a ramp so I could easily get to the window and look outside. Below are pictures of me, and my ramp."

CAT FACTS



Egyptians shaved their eyebrows as a sign of mourning when they lost a beloved cat.

The fumes from moth balls destroy a cat's liver cells. Use cedar in your closet instead.

- Stings to the mouth can be very dangerous to cats. If your cat is stung, or ever experiences any type of sting to the mouth, take her to the vet immediately. As her mouth swells from the sting, she may be unable to breathe. Stings require urgent medical care.
- Redecorating your home? Let your cat explore after the decorating is done. Paints, wallpaper pastes and paint thinners can be toxic to cats. Play it safe!
- Pet-proof your house by looking for items that may be dangerous to them. These include cleaners, antifreeze, automobile coolant, and rat poison.
- Ailurophilia is the "love of cats."
- The nose pad of a cat is ridged in a pattern that is unique, just like the fingerprint of a human.
- There are more than 500 million domestic cats in the world, with 33 different breeds.
- The American cat population reached nearly 68 million in 1996. American Demographics magazine estimates that's about 200 million kitty yawns per hour and a whopping 425 million catnaps each day!
- A cat's heart beats twice as fast as a human heart, at 110 to 140 beats per minute.
- 25% of cat owners blow dry their cats hair after a bath.
- The largest cat breed is the Ragdoll. Males weigh twelve to twenty pounds, with females weighing ten to fifteen pounds. The smallest cat breed is the Singapura. Males weigh about six pounds while females weigh about four pounds.

photographic developers

boric acid herbicides

pine-oil disinfectants

brake fluid insecticides rubbing alcohol nail polish

carburetor cleaner

kerosene dandruff shampoo

de-icers for melting snow

laxatives shoe polish

deodorizers lye

snail or bug bait diet pills

matches metal polish suntan lotion with cocoa butter

disinfectants drain cleaner mineral sprits turpentine

dry-cleaning fluid mothballs

windshield-washer fluid

wood preservatives fire-extinguisher foam

nail-polish remover
