Thank you all for your support of our efforts here at Fried's Cat Shelter! As always, large or small, your donations are equally appreciated!



Dear Human Friends,

Yippee! All the cats that were featured in our last newsletter have found forever homes!! This is a FIRST! Can we hope for an encore?

On my last visit to the leukemia building, I met Smokey. He is a FIV positive gray male who was born last July. A lady who runs a rescue operation in Chicago brought him to the shelter in March. He was incontinent in bowel and bladder...apparently someone had tried to neuter him with duct tape. Are you thinking what I am thinking? By now he is getting better litterbox-wise, and what is more important, he trusts our humans.

And then there is Flower, a 4-year old white shorthair. She was brought to the shelter 3 years ago with a wound around her neck that looked like she had a collar on that was too tight and had embedded itself into the skin. It took our humans almost 3 years of daily medications to heal her neck, and she still has to take weekly pills for the rest of her life. Her story has a happy ending: a few days ago, she was adopted.

Coming from Illinois...take I-94 East to Indiana exit 40B (Hwy 20/35 for Michigan City). Take that road till you come to the exit for Hwy 212 North (about 1/2 mile). When on 212 get into the left hand lane. We are on the left side of the road at the end of the curve in the highway.

Coming from Michigan...take I-94 West to exit 40B and follow the above directions.

Coming from South Bend...Take the 80/90 Toll Road West to La Porte Exit 49. When you come off the exit head North (a right turn) on Hwy 39. Go to the traffic light (Hwy 20) and turn left. Take Hwy 20 to the exit for Hwy 212 North (about 5-6 miles). When on 212 get into the left hand lane. We are on the left side of the road at the end of the curve in the highway.







CAT FACTS



Expect to spend an average of \$80 per year on vet bills, for the lifetime of each cat you own.







Choose your cat toys carefully. Choose light toys (for tossing), soft toys (for teeth and claws) and toys large enough that they can't be swallowed.

A flashlight makes a great cat toy! Turn the flash light on in a dark room, and watch your feline "chase" the beam of light!

Cats love to hide! If yours comes up "missing," be sure to check in the bathtub, in your closet, in the dresser drawers, under a blanket or rug...or any where else you can possibly think of!

A collar and tag can help your cat find his way home should he ever be lost. Better yet -- outfit your cat with an electronic identification chip.

To make sure your cat's collar fits properly, make sure you can slip two fingers under the collar, between the collar and your cat's neck.

The easiest way to pick up cat hair? Spray an anti-static spray on the area you want to clean. Wait one minute, then wipe up the hair with a six inch brush.


